When Mercy Finds You and Grace Renames You

2 Samuel 9:1-13

Power reveals character. When a man finally has the authority to settle old scores, we discover what truly governs his heart.

When mercy goes looking, grace does not just rescue the forgotten—it rewrites their identity and gives them a seat at the table.

1. MERCY THAT GOES LOOKING
Mercy is not accidental. It is intentional.
"Grace does not wait to be discovered; it goes searching."
2. MERCY CALLS YOU BY NAME, NOT BY YOUR PAST
God never calls us forward to shame us—He calls us forward to restore us.
"Grace speaks your name before it ever addresses your need."
3. MERCY MAKES ROOM WHERE FEAR EXPECTED REMOVAL
Grace does not deny brokenness; it dignifies it.
"Grace doesn't ask what you bring to the table—it tells you where to sit."
4. WHEN GRACE REWRITES YOUR IDENTITY
Grace does not erase your past; it reassigns your future.
"Grace doesn't erase your limp—it renames you anyway."
5. FROM SEARCHED FOR...TO SEATED FOREVER
"Grace is not a moment; it is a position."

Why this Theme?

A new year does not automatically bring renewal. Growth does not happen by accident. And churches do not drift into spiritual depth.

The greatest threat to God’s people is often not false doctrine or open sin - it is complacency. A quiet settling where faith becomes familiar and fruitfulness fades. God’s answer is not reinvention, but renewal.

What Does “Rooted to Rise” Mean?

Make us rooted—so that we may rise for your glory.


